**AS ALWAYS REMINDERS ABOUT THE NON-NEGOTIABLES:  
PLEASE ACCEPT THAT THESE ALL ADD TO CREATING THE BEST INCLUSIVE  
LEARNING ENVIRONMENT FOR OUR STUDENTS**

There are certain aspects of schooling that are non-negotiable at Narembeen DHS. These are those areas that are Department of Education legal requirements or, due to decision making processes through our parent representation on the School Board, have been made rules for our students. The following are the non-negotiables at Narembeen DHS:

- **SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER FOR 2020**

As an Independent Public School, Narembeen DHS has high expectations in all areas and it is **compulsory for our students to be in school uniform 100% of the time**. Our P & C ensures that all students have access to a well-priced uniform. I would like all parents and care-givers to note that a uniform is exactly that – **uniform**, and we are very sorry if the students cannot express their individuality! We believe that there are many hours in the day that allow the students to wear clothes, jewellery and make up to express their individual identity **but at school, they will wear the uniform that is mandated by our School Board**. I remind all students that:

- **SOCKS MUST BE SHORT AND PLAIN IN COLOUR**, preferably maroon, brown, white or black. The wearing of long coloured, patterned or multi-coloured socks is not allowed.
- **MAKE-UP IS NOT ALLOWED** by either gender.

**Please do not take offence if your child/ren are told not to wear inappropriate socks again, should they do so at all this year nor if they are asked to wash make-up off. We have uniform standards and we will enforce them!**

In 2018, the board, after a request from the Student Council, approved the wearing of a **maroon and gold cap to school. Only students in Years 4 – 10 can wear the cap**. Years K – 4 must still wear the brim or bucket hat.

**All parents and students are also reminded that:**

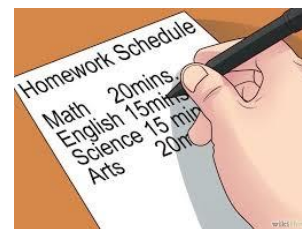
- For both genders, **facial piercing rings may not be worn and earrings may only be small studs or sleepers**. Piercing holes will not close up if rings/studs are not worn for the 6 hours of the school day. **This rule is not negotiable unless the piercing has just been completed!**
- **Jewellery, with the exception of a watch or simple necklace, is not allowed**. Students are not to be wearing large or bulky bracelets or necklaces to school, after all, the maroon is a hard colour to accessorise so it really isn't necessary 😊!

All of our students must be in the Narembeen DHS uniform as listed in the school handbooks. **This school uniform is compulsory!** We have a few new students this year but those of you who have had students here in the past, should not be surprised by this! The whole school community has supported this initiative over the years and this policy ensures that we look like the great school that we are 😊. **Lucy Lines** will continue to order the uniforms on behalf of the P & C Association and we thank her for her efforts.

- **HOMEWORK IN YEARS 4 - 10 (YOUR SUPPORT IS NEEDED AND IT DOES MAKE A DIFFERENCE)**

As always, our students will have homework. Students in the early years will have reading, spelling and some other activities, while upper primary and high school students will have subject specific assignments and tasks.

**High school students will also be expected to study for important tests.** If all of our Year 4 – 10 students start the year in a positive manner, organising their time so that homework is completed on a regular basis, then they will find it easier. Once again students from these year levels who do not complete their set tasks, and have no valid reason, will receive **‘Incompletion of Homework’** slips that they bring to me in the office. Students who do not finish homework by the due date will finish the task during their own time (recess or lunch). As instigated in 2016, students will **receive a yellow infringement after their third non-completion of homework.** This means that they can lose good standing due to the incompletion of homework. This action is in line with many schools that continually achieve high standards. If you would like to discuss the benefits of homework and the reasons it is given, please feel free to make an appointment.



- **NO STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO AFFECT THE LEARNING OF OTHERS – IN OTHER WORDS, THEY HAVE TO BEHAVE AND WHY WOULDN'T YOU WANT THIS FOR YOUR CHILD/CHILDREN!**

Our core business is to improve the educational outcomes of our students and enhance their academic performance through the delivery of excellent teaching and learning programs. We have a Behaviour Management Policy that outlines procedures to allow students to understand our expectations and **make changes to their behaviour before external action or consequences occur** (unless the initial behaviour is extreme). Our system of yellow, orange, red and black infringements allows the students to understand what is expected of them, as well as the consequences they receive should they not be able to adjust their behaviours. Outstanding behaviour and the development of strong values is a priority at Narembeen and, **as always at the start of the year, we make no apologies for our very high expectation in this area. Our students are expected to behave in an exemplary manner in all situations and display excellent manners and social skills in all situations.** We know you want the best for your child and that is why we have such support from the parent body when it comes to our behaviour expectations.

As our 2016 state review stated: **‘A rigorous behaviour management policy was developed with the involvement of the Board and has resulted in little or no poor behaviour ..... Narembeen DHS is commended for the work done on student behaviour management as an example of best practice.’**

It should be noted that at the end of 2018, the DoE have moved to have **ALL schools have GOOD STANDING** added to their behaviour management policies as well as suspensions for behaviours that are inappropriate behaviours including bullying. At the end of 2019, the DoE introduced a mobile phone ban in public schools ... they are catching up to us slowly ☺!!

- **PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND ALL FACTION CARNIVALS ARE COMPULSORY**

Physical Education is part of the WA Curriculum and is important for both physical and mental growth and development. Regardless of the ability of the student, they are to be involved in Physical Education. We have three carnivals throughout the year, all of which are followed by Interschool events two or three weeks afterwards. **The faction swimming, cross country and**

athletics carnivals are compulsory for all students in PP – Year 10. It has been great to watch the manner in which our students have become so engaged in these carnivals, cheering for all competitors and appreciating the efforts of all, not just the winners. **It is well documented that the increase in social media, gaming and screen time in general has seen a huge increase in OBESITY IN CHILDREN AND YOUNG ADOLESCENTS.** At least two hours of Physical Education is mandated, which we manage with the one hour of PE and the addition of daily fitness in the primary school and fitness TAG in the high school. It is so important to their general well-being, as well as gross motor skill development, and we will continue to expect all students to participate to the best of their ability. **You, as parents, have generally been terrific in your support of maintaining our target of 100% participation and it is great that you see the value in this very important aspect of your child/ren's growth.**

**ATTENDANCE ☹ CAN WE PLEASE WORK TOGETHER AND REMEMBER THAT IT IS NOT OK TO BE AWAY!! FRIDAY AFTERNOON STILL FALLS ON A SCHOOL DAY!!**



It is compulsory to attend school and it was great to see all of our students in attendance today. School is **COMPULSORY FOR OUR PRE PRIMARY STUDENTS AND IF YOU CHOOSE TO ENROL YOUR CHILD IN KINDERGARTEN, THEN THEY MUST ATTEND!** It is simply too difficult to ensure that our students have the best opportunity to improve and build on their learning if they are missing days. We expect to receive **relevant reasons for absences** and encourage you all to ensure that your child is at school every possible day. Illness and injury, plus those occasional unavoidable days, will always happen but our students should **not be missing days because they are not keen on what is happening on that day or to do activities such as go shopping, pick up siblings from other educational institutions or travel to Perth early to make it a 'long weekend'.** Last year saw further improvement in some areas **but there were still many students with below the magic number of 90% attendance.** We will be continuing to ask the hard questions regarding attendance if we believe any student is at educational risk due to a high level of unacceptable absences. As we did in the past couple of years, we will be making contact with parents of students that are missing school due to inappropriate reasons.

**IMPROVED EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES REQUIRES ATTENDANCE! PLEASE GET YOUR CHILDREN TO SCHOOL EVERY DAY THAT THEIR HEALTH ALLOWS ☺**

**IT'S NOT OK  
TO BE AWAY**

**BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT AND PARENT COMMITMENT  
MAKE YOUR CHILD BE ACCOUNTABLE FOR THEIR ACTIONS PLEASE!**

We have had a pretty tough Behaviour Management Policy for many years and you as parents are well aware of it. It did not happen overnight, but now, the students know the behaviour boundaries and **very few step over the mark,** the small behaviours have all but disappeared, as have most of the larger, orange infringement behaviours. **However, our system only works, if the parents or caregivers, support it at home.** By this I mean, **accept that the student has gained the infringement because of poor behaviour and discuss the issue seriously at home.** Should your child lose good standing through having gained 6 yellow infringements or 4



orange infringements (and really, they should start to adjust), the expectation would be that you support the school through both discussion and by **SENDING THE STUDENT TO SCHOOL ON A DAY THAT THEY ARE GOING TO MISS AN ACTIVITY OR POSITIVE REWARDS.** If the student is taught, through lack of parent support, that if they lose good standing, they will get a day off rather than miss an extra-curricular event, then they are not learning that poor behaviour comes with consequence, rather, that poor behaviour gets them a day off school!! I certainly hope that we have the support of 100% of our parents in our endeavour to see our students have both behaviours and values that are of a high standard.

**PLANNED AMENDMENT TO THE CURRENT BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT POLICY:** to be implemented after the board ratify the addition as developed by staff.

**‘A student who is not at school on a day that they will miss an activity or positive rewards day without a valid reason, will miss the next extra-curricular activity or positive rewards day.’**

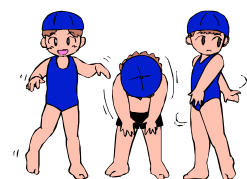
It should be noted that both the **Year 5/6 Camp** and **Year 7 - 10 Country Week** are extra-curricular events.

## PRE-PRIMARY DAYS REMINDER

Just a reminder to Pre-primary parents that these students are only attending four days a week for the first two weeks. They are not at school on **Wednesday March 5 and 12 2020**. On Wednesday March 12 2020, parents will need to ensure their child is at the **aquatic centre in time for their lesson**. Thank you very much for your assistance in this, it is not always easy to get them into town but we have found the four-day induction weeks beneficial to the students.

## MORNING DROP OFF

After the first couple of days, once the students have settled in, parents are requested to drop their students off at their classroom and then **promptly leave the school grounds**. Students need to **independently organise themselves for their day**. Please remember that students should **NOT BE AT SCHOOL PRIOR TO 8:30AM**.

## SWIMMING LESSONS

The specific details about these are being sent home today as a separate document but they start next **Monday February 10 2020** and will run for two weeks through to **Friday February 21 2020**. **Mrs Sarah Kuhne-Munroe** will be the Centre Supervisor and **Mrs Trista Federici** will be assisting her in delivering the program. **Mr Chick will be putting the pool blankets on in the evenings to keep the water as warm as possible for us as the nights start to cool down**. We would like to thank **Mrs Joy Butler** and the **Busy Blue Bus Albany** for donating a school bus & driver for the two weeks so that our younger students do not have to walk down and back in the heat. This is a huge bonus for them all and we appreciate the time that Joy will be giving us. We would also like to thank the **Shire of Narembeen** for **waiving the entry fee for students without season tickets for these sessions**.

Lastly, for some of the younger students who are still not confident in the water, swimming lessons may cause anxiety. We have found that they will be more involved in their lessons and **willing to 'have a go' if their mums are not present**. Obviously it is a public centre and we cannot demand that parents keep clear of the pool during their child/ren's lessons, but it is definitely the preferred option. Even on Wednesday February 12 2020, when parents need to take their Pre-primary student in for their lesson, it would be best if you drop off and then pick up ☺.

## FACTION AND INTERSCHOOL SWIMMING CARNIVALS

This is early notice that the proposed date for the **Faction Swimming Carnival** is **Friday March 6 2020** commencing at **9:45am at the Narembeen Aquatic Centre**. ## FRIDGE FOR LUNCHES

There is a fridge for use by students in Years 1 – 10 for their lunches or juice boxes/drink bottles.
